- 1. <u>CALL MEETING TO ORDER:</u> The Chair, Hollis Carlile, called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.

- 3. <u>APPROVE MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 12, 2009</u> The Chair, Hollis Carlile, asked if there were any comments regarding the Minutes of November 12, 2009. Hearing none, the Minutes for November 12, 2009, were approved as submitted.

Patrick Houlihan presented the report. Chevron USA, Inc. (CUSA) is seeking a short variance for a cumulative, consecutive period of 24 hours to occur sometime between December 10, 2009, and March 9, 2010, to allow the continued storage of volatile organic compounds (VOC) containing liquids in the tanks without an operational vapor recovery system.

Petitioner, John Gruber, stated their petition was accurately described; but wished to note item 9 of page 4 (four) should read March 24, 2010, not March 24, 2009. The change was duly noted by Patrick Houlihan. Mr. Gruber reiterated that the new tanks are actually already constructed. This electrical work is necessary before the new tanks can be placed into service to ensure electrical infrastructure can accommodate the load from the new tanks. They estimate it to take much less than 24 hours and much less emissions are expected.

Ms. Dunn asked if they are adding the tanks or replacing them. Mr. Gruber responded they are adding.

Patrick Houlihan presented the report. Aera Energy, LLC (AERA) is seeking a short variance for a consecutive period of 24 hours to occur sometime between January 4, 2010, and April 1, 2010, to allow the continued storage of VOC containing liquids at the MOCO dehydration facility without an operational vapor recovery system.

Petitioner, Robert Beebout, stated the District accurately summarized their situation. PG & E notified them that they will be performing maintenance and therefore electrical power would be shut off to AERA. This variance request is a result of PG & E's scheduled power outage.
