The Air Pollution Control Officer has issued the Authority to Construct permits to Agri-World Cooperative for the operation of six diesel-fired IC engines with various horsepower ratings powering agricultural irrigation pumps, at 31545 Donald Ave in Madera. Enclosed are the Authority to Construct permits and a copy of the notice of final action to be published approximately three days from the date of this letter.

Notice of the District's preliminary decision to issue the Authority to Construct permits was published on May 24, 2018. The District's analysis of the proposal was also sent to CARB and US EPA Region IX on May 17, 2018. No comments were received following the District's preliminary decision on this project.
