

**NOTICE OF PRELIMINARY DECISION
FOR THE PROPOSED SIGNIFICANT MODIFICATION
OF FEDERALLY MANDATED OPERATING PERMIT**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District solicits public comment on the proposed significant modification of the Federally Mandated Operating Permit to Chevron USA Inc at its oilfield facility located at the Heavy Western Stationary Source in Kern County, California. Chevron USA Inc is proposing to streamline and standardize the permits for the steam generators, thermally enhanced oil recovery (TEOR) wells, heavy oil tanks, IC engines, flares, and turbines by moving the common permit conditions to the facility-wide permit.

The District's analysis of the legal and factual basis for this proposed action, project # S-1120205, is available for public inspection at http://www.valleyair.org/notices/public_notices_idx.htm and at any District office. There are no emission increases associated with this proposed action. This will be the public's only opportunity to comment on the specific conditions of the modification.
