District staff will also outline a proposed process to develop a Climate Change Action Plan (CCAP), as directed by the District's Governing Board on August 21, 2008. Interested parties will be invited to participate in this scoping meeting and in future workgroups to provide comments and offer suggestions to guide the development of the CCAP.
