		<i>The extreme drought currently being experienced in the San Joaquin Valley and across the western United States has led to a number of conditions that have exacerbated the Valley’s air quality challenge. Due to the excessively dry conditions and build-up of combustible materials in forests and national parks surrounding the San Joaquin Valley, the region has experienced a number of large wildfires. Air pollution generated from wildfires have overwhelmed emission reduction efforts in the San Joaquin Valley and resulted in periods of excessively high particulate matter and ozone concentrations. The District intends to present an item to the Governing Board regarding wildfire air quality impacts and potential actions that the District may pursue to minimize future air quality impacts from wildfires. These actions may include efforts to compel state and federal land managers to pursue policies that minimize fuel build-up and expedites fire suppression. The purpose of this item is to solicit CAC advice and recommendations as this matter is presented to the Governing Board.</i>
