- 3. <u>APPROVE MINUTES OF AUGUST 7, 2007</u> The Minutes for August 7, 2007 were approved as submitted.
- 4. Public Comments None
- 5. CHAIR COMMENTS None
- 6. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/APCO COMMENTS —Seyed Sadredin, Executive Director/APCO, stated the Governing Board unanimously approved the Environmental Justice Strategy, which includes the formation of an Environmental Justice Advisory Group (EJAG). He noted the EJAG will be formed of one member from each CAC interest group, two members from the EJ advisory group that helped the District prepare the strategy, and one District staff member. He suggested the CAC interest groups meet and nominate a member for the EJAG. Kevin Hamilton made a motion to ask the Clerk to contact the Chair of each interest group and ask them to solicit volunteers/nominations for the EJAG, and add to the agenda for the October 2, 2007 CAC meeting.

Motion passes to request the Clerk to contact the Chair of each interest group and ask them to solicit volunteers/nominations for the EJAG, and add to the agenda for the October 2, 2007 CAC meeting.

Mr. Sadredin also stated a Valley-specific health study, which focuses on the individual's exposure to air pollution and its relation fo the cause of asthma, was also passed.

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) Meeting ACTION SUMMARY MINUTES September 4, 2007

He noted there will be public hearings for four separate Rules, on the agenda for the upcoming Governing Board meeting of September 20th. Additionally, the lease for the new Bakersfield office will be on the agenda. Mr. Sadredin noted the new office will be LEED certified and include solar power. Mr. Sadredin added ARB's task force to expedite attainment in the Valley recently met in Fresno, Parlier and Arvin.

<u>CAC Member Comments:</u> Kevin Hamilton requested Tim Tynor present an outline of his health study to the CAC.

7. <u>UPDATE: FAST TRACK TO ATTAINMENT</u>— Seyed Sadredin, Executive Director/APCO, presented the report. He noted the Fast Track Task Force meets most Tuesdays, and their focus is on finding new and innovative ways to reduce the emissions that cause ozone. Some of the measures they have looked at are Green Contracting with cities and counties, Truck retrofit and replacement, and enhancements to the Spare the Air Program. He noted the Symposium scheduled for Visalia on October 3rd and 4th, will focus on the Fast Track, and will examine goods movement in the Valley.

CAC Member Comments: David Harrald noted Biztalk 2007 follows the Symposium October 5th with Vincente Fox being the keynote speaker. Mr. Harrald also asked how the wildfires have impacted the Valley. Mr. Sadredin stated the fires have had some impact on the Valley, but have also allowed the District to see how pollution flows into the Valley.

Mary-Michal Rawling stated she would like to see a more aggressive Spare the Air Program. Mr. Sadredin stated the District is planning an expanded Spare the Air Program in which the District will work with employers to have Spare the Air events encouraging people to use alternative modes of transportation and other Spare the Air ideas.

Sarah Sharpe asked when the Governing Board will vote on the ARB SOON Program (In-Use Off-road Diesel Vehicle Rule). Mr. Sadredin stated he is hoping to start in 2008, but the District needs more funding.

- 8. <u>UPDATE: PROPOSED PM2.5 PLAN</u>—George Heinen, Supervising Air Quality Engineer, presented the report. He noted the PM2.5 Draft Plan will be available soon. He stated the PM10 Maintenance Plan will go to the Governing Board on September 20. Seyed Sadredin, Executive Director/APCO, stated the PM2.5 Plan is waiting on a key piece of modeling data from ARB.
- 9. <u>RULES UNDER DEVELOPMENT—</u>George Heinen, Supervising Air Quality Engineer, presented the report. He stated four Rule Projects are scheduled for the Governing Board meeting on September 20th, Rule 4703, 4651, 4682, and 46xx (organic solvents).

<u>CAC Member Comments</u>: Les Clark stated industry would like more justification to the fee increase. Kevin Hamilton asked when the last fee increase was, and Mr. Sadredin stated the fees were last raised in 1997. He noted the District has the lowest fees of any air district in the State, and has the lowest overhead. He noted only 30% of the costs of the programs are paid through fees.

10. Public Education Report Education Representative, presented the report. Ms. Velasquez stated the Spare the Air Season is still underway. The Outreach and Communication Department has been busy doing outreach to the community. She stated the District is offering three Neuton lawnmowers to radio listeners in a contest. The District is also seeking more employer partners for the Spare the Air Program.

Ms. Velasquez stated the deadline for the entries for the Clean Air Kids Calendar is October 1, 2007. She noted the Symposium will be held in Visalia on October 3rd and 4th, and registration forms are available online or in each District office. She added that the K-5 curriculum is now available, and encouraged the CAC to tell teachers to contact the District for more information. The District will also perform direct outreach to the schools.

<u>CAC Member Comments:</u> Mary-Michal Rawling requested an email from the District soliciting calendar entries, and a one page summary on the curriculum, so she can forward them to teachers and schools. Ms. Velasquez stated the curriculum summary is online with the order form, but she would send an email out to the CAC on the calendar entries.

Kevin Hamilton expressed his admiration for Outreach and Communication's work on the web site as well as the quality of the commercials. He also suggested the District reach out to the American Lung Association of California to help participate with the ALA's upcoming events.

- 11. <u>ARB COMMENTS</u> Jeff Lindberg, ARB, presented the report. Mr. Lindberg stated there will be a meeting on September 5th in Sacramento to discuss greenhouse gasses. He added there will be another meeting on September 17th to discuss early actions required under AB32. He stated the next ARB Task Force is tentatively scheduled for September 24th in Fresno in the District offices.

RULES AND PLANS ADOPTED IN SEPTEMBER 2007

Rule 46xx Organic Solvents: Amendments to the existing District coating rules implement a VOC control measure in the Ozone Plan. Amendments lower the existing the VOC limits of organic cleaning solvents used in numerous coating operations including metal parts, automotive and mobile equipment, wood products, graphic arts, aerospace assembly and components, degreasing operation, can and coil coating, glass coating, adhesive applications, and polyester resin operations. Estimated VOC emissions reduction is 1,200 tons/year.

Rule 4651 (Soil Decontamination): Amendments to Rule 4651 implement a VOC control measure in the Ozone Plan. The rule incorporates exemptions, limits, practices, monitoring, and recordkeeping requirements to ensure the rule is as stringent as other air districts' rules and meets BACM, BACT, and RACT standards. Estimated VOC emissions reduction is 10 tons/year.

Rule 4682 (Polymeric Foam Manufacturing): Amendments to Rule 4682 implements a VOC control measure in the Ozone Plan. The amendments reduce the VOC emissions from the manufacture and storage of foam products. Estimated VOC emissions reduction is 137 tons/year.

Rule 4703 (Stationary Gas Turbines): Amendments to Rule 4703 implement a NOx control measure in the one-hour Extreme Ozone Plan. The amendments control emission from smaller and part-time turbines used for distributed power generation. Estimated VOC emissions reduction is 800 tons/year..

2007 PM10 Maintenance Plan and Request for Redesignation: The federal Clean Air Act requires the District to submit a PM10 Maintenance Plan (Plan) so that EPA can complete the process of re-designating the District in attainment of the PM10 NAAQS. The Plan demonstrates continued attainment for 10 years after EPA re-designates the District. Staff anticipates EPA's action on the re-designation request would be complete in 2009.

Regulation III (Fees): Rule 3010 (Permit Fee); Rule 3020 (Permit Fee Schedules); Rule 3030 (Hearing Board Fees); Rule 3040 (Open Burning Fees; Rule 3050 (Asbestos Removal Fees); Rule 3060 (Emission Reduction Credit Banking Fee); Rule 3070 (Other Charges); Rule 3080 (Atmospheric Acidity Protection Act Program Fee); Rule 3090 (California Clean Air Act Fees); Rule 3110 (Air Toxics Fees); Rule 3120 (Regulation VIII Alternative Compliance Plan Review Fee); Rule 3135 (Dust Control Plan Fee); Rule 3140 (Fees For Certification Of Air Permitting Professionals); Rule 3150 (Fees For Portable Equipment Registration); Rule 3155 (Permit-Exempt Equipment Registration Fees); Rule 3160 (Prescribed Burning Fees); Rule 3180 (Administrative Fees For Indirect Source Review); Rule 3190 (Conservation Management Practices Plan Fee): Amendments to the Fees Regulation would consist of an eight percent increase in most of the District fees effective on the date of rule adoption, a second 8% increase effective on July 1, 2009, and an expansion of the applicability of the permit application evaluation fee so that the costs of application processing are directly recovered by the District via assessment of an hourly fee. Contact: Carlos Garcia. Status: Public workshop was held on September 5, 2007. Governing Board Hearing: December 20, 2007.

OCTOBER 2007

Rule 4354 (Glass Melting Furnaces): Amendments to Rule 4354 would implement a NOx control measure in the Ozone Plan. Amendments would lower existing NOx limits, reduce the allowable duration of time of start-up and shutdown, reduce the emissions averaging measurement period, and establish new limits for SOx and PM emissions. Contact: Sandra Lowe Leseth. Status: Scoping meeting was held on June 4 and 5, 2007. The first workshop is scheduled for October 8, 2007. Governing Board Hearing: Third Quarter 2008.

Rule 4307 (Boilers, Steam Generators, and Process Heaters - 2.0 MMBtu/hr to 5.0 MMBtu/hr): Amendments to Rule 4307 would implement a NOx control measure in the Ozone Plan. Amendments would remove the exemption for boilers, steam generator, and process heaters operated at public and private schools K1-K12, and require such units to comply with the rule. Additional amendment would include lowering the low use units from 5 billion Btu per year to 1.8 billion Btu per year of heat input. Contact: Manuel Salinas. Status: First workshop is tentatively scheduled for October 16, 2007. Governing Board Hearing: Third Quarter 2008.

Rule 4306 Phase 3 (Boilers, Steam Generators, and Process Heaters): Amendments to Rule 4306 would implement a NOx control measure commitment in the Ozone Plan, and a control measure in the District's PM2.5 Plan that is currently under development. Amendments would lower the current NOx limits and establish PM10/2.5 and SO₂ emission limits. Contact: Manuel Salinas. Status: First workshop is tentatively scheduled for late October 2007. Governing Board Hearing: Third Quarter 2008.

RULES AND PLANS UNDER DEVELOPMENT

OCTOBER 2007 (continued)

Rule 4621 (Gasoline Transfer into Stationary Storage Containers, Delivery Vessels, and Bulk Plants, Rule 4622 (Gasoline Transfer into Motor Vehicle Fuel Tanks), and Rule 4624 (Organic Liquid Loading): Amendments to Rules 4621, 4622, and 4624 would implement VOC control measures in the one-hour Extreme Ozone Plan. Amendments would address the standards for equipment maintenance and repair, inspection frequency, and retrofit or replacement of old systems with newer technologies to reduce VOC emissions. Estimated VOC emissions reduction is about 300 tons/year. Contact: Peter Biscay. Status: The Receive and File action is scheduled for October 18, 2007. Governing Board Hearing: December 20, 2007.

Aviation Fuel Transfer: Control of emissions from aviation fuel transfer would implement a VOC control measure in the one-hour Extreme Ozone Plan. The VOC control requirements for aviation fuel transfer would be addressed as part of the rule development project to amend Rule 4621, which currently in progress. Contact: Manuel Salinas. Status: The Receive and File action for the proposed amendments to Rule 4621 is scheduled for October 18, 2007. Governing Board Hearing: December 20, 2007.

Rule 7011 (Hexavalent Chromium - Chrome Plating and Chromic Acid Anodizing Operations): Amendments to Rule 7011 would implement the revised Airborne Toxic Control Measure (ATCM) for Chromium Plating and Chromic Acid Anodizing Facilities that the California Air Resources Board adopted on December 7, 2006. The District is required to implement the ATCM six months after its approval by the Office of Administrative Law which is expected to occur by September 24, 2007. Contact: Glenn T. Reed. Status: Workshop is tentatively scheduled for October 2007. Governing Board Hearing: January 2008.

2008 PM2.5 Plan: The first National Ambient Air Quality Standard for PM2.5 was set in 1997. The Federal Clean Air Act requires the District to develop a PM2.5 plan for submission to EPA by April 2008. Contact: Don Hunsaker. Status: First workshop is tentatively scheduled for late Fall. The final Plan is due to the EPA by April 5, 2008.

Negative Declaration for EPA Control Techniques Guidelines (CTG) for Flat Wood Paneling Coatings: In September 2006, EPA finalized and issued a CTG (EPA 453/R-06-004) that established Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) standards for flat wood paneling coating operations. The federal Clean Air Act requires ozone nonattainment areas such as the San Joaquin Valley (SJV) to implement RACT for sources that are subject to the CTG. Staff have determined that there are no flat wood paneling manufacturing and coating operations in the SJV, and therefore would recommend the Governing Board adopt a Negative Declaration.
