- 5. CHAIR COMMENTS None
- 6. <u>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/APCO COMMENTS</u> Samir Sheikh, Executive Director/APCO, provided CAC members with a summary of the following items:
  - The District was recently awarded \$6,961,054 from federal EPA in response to proposals submitted under the highly competitive Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA) fiscal year 2019 National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program. These funds will be used to replace yard trucks, agricultural tractors, and switcher locomotives with cleaner units.
  - The District was recently awarded \$10 million from the federal EPA in response to proposals submitted under the highly competitive Targeted Air Shed Grant Program. These funds will be used to replace yard trucks and agricultural tractors with cleaner units.
  - At the upcoming August Governing Board meeting, the Board will consider implementing a new incentive program focused on clean vehicle fueling infrastructure projects. The \$15 million program would support deployment of new clean fuel infrastructure projects such as battery charging and alternative fueling stations throughout the Valley.
  - The 2019 ozone season has been very good to date, and the Valley is on track to experience a record low number of days exceeding the federal ozone standards.
  - The District's annual Governing Board Study Session is scheduled for October 16-17, 2019, in Bass Lake, CA, and CAC members are encouraged to attend.

### 8. VERBAL REPORT FROM CALIFORNIA AIR RESOURCES BOARD -

- Laura Carr, CARB representative, provided a summary of select items that were considered by the California Air Resources Board at their meetings held in June and July, 2019
- b. David Mallory, CARB Enforcement Division Manager, provided an update on CARB's review of the District's Emission Reductions Credit (ERC) program. He reminded CAC members that the CARB Board directed staff to conduct the review of the District's program with the goal of the review being to describe how the District's ERC program works, determine whether the program is meeting state and federal requirements, and identify if any potential opportunities for improvement exist. Mr. Mallory advised the members that CARB plans to hold a public workshop to provide a status update on the review in early September and then provide an update to their Board on September 19, 2019.

Mr. Cunha asked that CAC members be notified of the date of the next public workshop on the ERC review. Mr. Mallory responded affirmatively. Mr. Cunha requested an inperson presentation from CARB representatives on the ERC Review at the next CAC meeting on September 3, 2019. Mr. Mallory responded affirmatively and committed to providing an in-person presentation at the next CAC meeting.

9. REVIEW RECENT CHANGES TO THE RESIDENTIAL WOOD-BURNING STRATEGY – Jaime Holt, Chief Communications Officer, provided an update on the Governing Board's recent actions to enhance the District's comprehensive residential wood-burning strategy. Consistent with commitments in the 2018 PM2.5 Plan, in June 2019, the Governing Board adopted amendments to Rule 4901 to lower the mandatory wood-burning curtailment levels in the hot-spot counties of Fresno, Madera and Kern; to enhance the disclosure requirements on the sale/transfer of residential real property; to add provisions addressing significant remodels of fireplaces/chimney; to enhance

restrictions on the installation new wood burning devices; and to enhance visible smoke emission requirements. In addition, the Board adopted enhancements to the District's Burn Cleaner incentive program to increase incentive levels in hot-spot areas with access to natural gas service and to limit the types of replacement devices to natural gas inserts or electric heat pumps in those areas. The program amendments also now allow the funding on electric heat pumps in the other Valley counties as well.

Mr. Williams thanked Ms. Holt for the great presentation. He suggested there would be pushback from realtors for any fees attached to reporting requirements. Ms. Holt said there are no fees charged by the District for required disclosures.

Mr. Hamilton complimented staff for adding electric heat pumps to the program.

### 10. AB 617 IMPLEMENTATION UPDATES -

a. Dave Warner, Deputy APCO, provided an update on the District's activities related to AB 617 implementation. In September 2018, CARB finalized their selection of 10 communities statewide, including the communities of South Central Fresno and the City of Shafter in the Valley, for first year implementation of AB 617 community emission reduction and monitoring programs. Consistent with the requirements of AB 617, the District has appointed steering committees for the two selected communities, and the committees have been meeting over the past several months. Working with the steering committees, the District must implement community air monitoring plans by July 1, 2019, and adopt community emission reduction programs by October 1, 2019. Mr. Hamilton said he was very impressed with how the District has approached the AB 617 process. He said he has heard from many community members that the District has been very responsive to the concerns that they have. He thanked staff for their quick actions when addressing concerns or misunderstandings.

b. Vernon Hughes, CARB Office of Community Air Protection Branch Manager, provided an update on efforts underway by ARB to implement AB 617. Consistent with AB 617, the CARB board must consider new communities each year for implementation of Community Emission Reduction Programs (CERPs). Based on the amount of work necessary to develop and implement the program in the 10 communities selected in Year 1 and the budgetary constraints associated with funding the program, Mr. Hughes reported that it is likely that only up to 3 new communities may be selected statewide in Year 2 of the program. Mr. Hughes said their Board will consider final recommendations on

the Year 2 communities at their December meeting following several months of public process. Mr. Hughes also reported that their Board will consider the CERPs for the Year 1 communities between December 2019 and March 2020. The Board will be meeting in the respective communities to consider the CERPs after they are adopted by the local air district boards.
