Dennis Tristao requested that at the next CAC Meeting and the Governing Board meeting he would encourage and request that Cal Rossi or a member of the Governor's staff give a presentation to us on the Governor's Hydrogen Highway and what they envision it to be.

Dennis Tristao requested staff find out what incentives are available for funding the Hydrogen Highway.

Dennis Tristao stated he did not know if staff could do this, but there has been questions raised on the conversion on diesel powered deep well electric pumps going to electricity if the grid would be able to handle that load and if there was a reliable electrical supply to accomplish this. Mr. Tristao noted it would interesting

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to get a report back if all of the eight thousand engines in the inventory be put on electricity if the grid could handle that or not.
