Background

- Climate protection mandates will be demanding
- AB 32 (Global Warming Solutions Act) imposes no direct mandates on local air districts
- CEQA challenges/litigation relating to GHGs
- Local land-use agencies and businesses have sought expert assistance from local air districts
- District can play a supportive role and take leadership in facilitating compliance
- Governing Board approved CCAP in August 2008





AB 32 - Summary

- Reduce greenhouse gases (GHGs) to 1990 levels by 2020 (25% reduction)
- Reduce greenhouse gases to 80% below 1990 levels by 2050 (executive order)
- Mandatory GHG emissions reporting
- Early Action Measures (GHG reductions) to be implemented before 2010
- "Scoping Plan" to achieve the 2020 reductions (final draft just released, ARB vote in November)





Climate Change Action Plan Goals

- Assist local land-use agencies with GHG CEQA issues
- Assist Valley businesses in complying with the mandates of AB32
- Ensure that climate protection measures do not cause emissions adversely affecting public health or environmental justice





Climate Change Action Plan Specific Actions

- Authorizes the APCO to begin the public process to formulate recommendations for Board's consideration for the following:
 - CEQA guidelines for local land-use agencies
 - San Joaquin Valley Carbon Exchange Bank
- Authorizes the APCO to craft voluntary GHG mitigation agreements for Board consideration





Climate Change Action Plan Specific Actions (cont'd)

- Support win-win measures that reduce both GHGs and criteria pollutants
- Oppose measures that result in significant increase in toxic or criteria pollutant emissions
 - Top priorities public health and environmental justice





CEQA Issues

- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires addressing environmental impacts
- Legal challenges have delayed CEQA projects
- Technical needs:
 - Quantify GHG emissions
 - Identify significant climate change impacts
 - Identify feasible mitigation measures
 - Administer/implement voluntary mitigation measures





CEQA guidelines for GHGs

- Public process including input from local agencies
- Options to be considered:
 - GHG significance threshold(s)
 - Tiered classification of project's impact
 - Approaches to assure varying degrees of feasible mitigation
 - Inclusion of GHG mitigation measures in General Plans with minimal project-specific review when project is consistent with the Plan
 - Others
- Bring recommendations to Board in Summer of 2009






SJV Carbon Exchange Bank

- Public process to develop rules for administering a bank
- Voluntary and early reductions created in SJV
- Reductions must be quantifiable, surplus, permanent, and enforceable
- Model after the District's existing ERC bank
- Develop and follow internationally recognized protocols
- Work closely with ARB and California Climate Action Registry to ensure compatibility
- Banked credits will be available for multiple uses
- Recommendations to Board in Summer of 2009





Integrated Emissions Reporting

- Designed to assist businesses in complying with ARB's mandatory reporting requirements
- Designed to minimize duplicative reporting to ARB and the District
- Enhancements to existing criteria pollutant emissions inventory program
- Voluntary, web-based
- Test in 2009, operational in 2010





Voluntary Mitigation Agreements

- Model after past agreements for criteria pollutants
- Each contract subject to Board approval
- Mitigate GHG increases from new projects
- Assist land-use agencies and developers
- Funding provided by developers
- Consider pooling resources when needed
- Fund using District's successful incentive program
- Fund projects providing public health cobenefits





Extensive Public Process for Developing CCAP Components

- First scoping meeting tentatively scheduled for Nov. 19, 2008
- Followed by workgroup meetings workgroups will provide recommendations to APCO
- Develop guidance and tools for Land Use/Carbon credit banking system
- Public workshops for proposed guidance documents, enhancements to existing programs, necessary regulations, and other tools
- Proposals to Governing Board by Summer 2009





Options for CAC involvement

- CAC may request that staff provide updates as draft proposals are developed
- CAC representatives may participate directly in workgroups throughout process
- CAC may establish a subcommittee to review and provide recommendations on proposals
- CAC would ultimately develop a recommendation to Governing Board on proposals
