11. The Central Region Hearing Board has heard and granted the following emergency variances since the December 16, 2015, hearing:

A. Docket C-15-37E – Avenal State Prison

On December 30, 2015, Hearing Board Chair, Jerry K. Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from December 30, 2015, through January 28, 2016. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, and 2520 and allowed for the continued operation of boiler #3 while exceeding the annual permitted heat input limit.

B. Docket C-16-02E - Guardian Industries Corp

On February 1, 2016, Hearing Board Chair, Jerry K. Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from February 1, 2016, through February 5, 2016. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354 and allowed for continued glass manufacturing with excess visible emissions while the exhaust stream bypasses the scrubber, EP, and SCR so that maintenance can be performed on the EP.
