- 11. The Central Region Hearing Board heard and granted the following emergency variance:
 - A. <u>C-17-27E</u> Guardian Industries

On November 7, 2017, Hearing Board Chair, Jerry Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from November 7, 2017, through November 11, 2017. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354, and allowed for continued glass manufacturing with excess visible emissions, while the exhaust stream bypassed the pre-conditioning chamber, caustic soda injection, and EP so the facility could repair the EP.
