A. <u>Docket C-16-30E</u> – Aera Energy LLC

On December 28, 2016, Hearing Board Chair, Mr. Jerry K. Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from December 29, 2016, and January 5, 2017. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4401 and 4623, and allowed for the continued storage of VOC containing liquids at the Section 32 Dehydration facility without a functional or operating vapor recovery system until the leak on the soft water system is repaired.

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B. <u>Docket C-17-02E</u> - Vitro Flat Glass LLC

On January 11, 2017, Hearing Board Chair, Mr. Jerry K Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from January 11, 2017, until February 6, 2017. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 1080, 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354 and allowed for the continued operation of the glass melting furnace and glass production without the use of the CEMS/COMS and while the exhaust stream bypasses the electrostatic precipitator and wet scrubber so the electrostatic precipitator can be repaired.
