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10. Stipulated Order of Abatement report:

A Stipulated Order of Abatement was granted by the Central Region Hearing Board on December 16, 2015, between the District and Agricultural Growers to allow the burning of orchard removal material in situations where no economically feasible option is available. - 11. The Central Region Hearing Board heard and granted the following emergency variances since the April 19, 2017, hearing:
 - A. <u>C-17-11E</u> Guardian Industries Corp.

On April 21, 2017, Hearing Board Chair, Mr. Jerry K Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from April 21, 2017, until May 13, 2017. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2520, 4101, and allowed for continued glass manufacturing with excess visible emissions while the exhaust stream bypassed the emissions control systems so maintenance could be conducted on the electrostatic precipitator (EP).

B. <u>C-17-12E</u> - CertainTeed Corporation

On May 4, 2017, Hearing Board Chair, Mr. Jerry K Boren, acting for and on behalf of the Central Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from May 2, 2017, until June 1, 2017. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 1080, 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, 4354, and allowed for continued glass manufacturing with excess visible emissions, while the exhaust stream bypassed the pre-conditioning chamber, caustic soda injection, EP, and Continuous Emissions Monitoring System so the facility could clean out precipitated debris from the EP Dry Scrubber.
