On May 24, 2004, Hearing Board Member James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from May 26, 2004, to May 31, 2004. Said variance provided relief from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201, and allowed multiple start-ups and tuning activities of a turbine generator unit with excess NO<sub>x</sub>, CO, and NH<sub>3</sub> emissions.

On July 1, 2004, Hearing Board Member James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from July 2, 2004, to August 1, 2004. Said variance provided relief from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201, and allowed continued operation of the furnace without a functioning opacity monitor until the unit can be repaired and reinstalled.
