5. The Central Region Hearing Board approved the following emergency variance orders:
 - A. Docket #C-06-13E – Certaineed Corporation

On September 12, 2006, Hearing Board chairman James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from September 12, 2006, to September 14, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, 4101, and 4202 to allow the glass-melting furnace to bypass the dry electrostatic precipitator while a buildup of material is removed.
 - B. Docket #C-06-14E – Certaineed Corporation

On November 13, 2006, Hearing Board chairman James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from November 20, 2006, to November 21, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201, to allow the continued operation of the

subject glass-melting furnace without the dry electrostatic precipitator while the transformers are replaced.

C. Docket #C-06-15E – California State Prison - Avenal

On December 15, 2006, Hearing Board chairman James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from December 15, 2006, to January 13, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201, to allow continued operation of the subject boiler while both of the Cleaver Brooks boilers are in operation to meet steam demands.

D. Docket #C-06-16E – Darling International

On December 21, 2006, Hearing Board chairman James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from December 21, 2006, to January 2, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rule 2010, to allow the operation of the subject Nebraska Boiler with excess ammonia emissions.

E. Docket #C-07-01E – Guardian Industries Corporation

On February 15, 2007, Hearing Board member Mr. Jerry Boren approved an emergency variance effective from February 14, 2007, to March 15, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, 2520, and 4101, to allow the continuation of glass production while using propane fired burners in addition to the release of excess emissions.

F. Docket #C-07-02E – Aera Energy LLC

On April 26, 2007, Hearing Board member Mr. Gerry Mulligan approved an emergency variance effective from April 26, 2007, to April 28, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, 2520, and 4623, to allow the continued operation of the subject equipment without an operational VRS while efforts are made to isolate and repair the water leaks effecting the operation of the generators.
