The following emergency variance orders have been approved by the Central Region Hearing Board:

A. <u>Docket #C-03-03E</u> – Sanger Power LLC 1125 Muscat Avenue, Sanger CA 93657

On May 20, 2003, Hearing Board Chairman, James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from May 27, 2003, to June 15, 2003. Said variance provided relief from the requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201, as they pertain to the release of excess NO_X and CO emissions during start-up and tuning activities of a gas-fired turbine, and the diesel-fired start-up package to exceed its two hour per day operating limit.

B. <u>Docket #C-03-04E</u> – CertainTeed Corporation 17775 Avenue 23 ½, Chowchilla, CA 93610

On May 23, 2003, Hearing Board Chairman, James V. Glaser, MD, approved an emergency variance effective from May 23, 2003, to June 1, 2003. Said variance provided relief from the requirements of District Rules 1080, and 2070.7.0, as they pertain to continued operation of the manufacturing process without a properly operating opacity monitor.

C. <u>Docket #C-03-06E</u> – Coalinga Cogeneration Company 32812 Gale Avenue, Coalinga, CA

On June 20, 2003, Hearing Board Chairman, James V. Glaser approved an emergency variance effective from June 18, 2003, to July 17, 2003. Said variance provided relief from the requirements of District Rules 1080, 2070.7.0, and 4703, as they pertain to the requirement to provide continuous emissions data to the District.

D. <u>Docket #C-03-07E</u> – NEO California Power LLC 16457 Avenue 24 ½, Chowchilla, CA

On July 1, 2003, Hearing Board Chairman, James V. Glaser, MD, approved emergency variance effective from June 26, 2003, to July 16, 2003. Said variance provided relief from the requirements of District Rules 2010, 2201, and 4701, as they pertain to the release of excess NO_X and CO emissions during the modification, tuning, and testing of twelve IC engines.
