Ms. Bussard presented the Staff Report.

Aera has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4401, and 4623, in addition to applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for a consecutive 24-hour period to occur sometime between December 1, 2016, and December 31, 2016, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow Aera to continue to store VOC containing liquids at the Section 32 Dehydration Facility without a functional or operating VRS while they repair the soft water shipping pipeline.

Mr. Mulligan asked where the water line is located. Mr. Parcel explained the water line is both above and below ground. Mr. Mulligan asked if this project is part of the pipes in the Coalinga hills. Mr. Parcel responded affirmatively.

Mr. Boren asked how long the line is. Mr. Parcel responded approximately 2,000 feet. Mr. Boren asked if the project can be completed in one day. Mr. Parcel explained all pre-installation work will be completed to reduce the time of shut down.

Mr. Mulligan asked the kind of pipe being used. Mr. Parcel said it's all steel pipe.

Dr. Goodwin asked what is the life of the pipe before it has to be replaced. Mr. Parcel said the current pipe has been in place for approximately 22 years. Dr. Goodwin asked what past practices have been used with the current pipe during leaks and other issues. Mr. Parcel explained variances have been granted to replace sections of the pipe.

Having decided the petition has met the required findings, on motion of Mr. Mulligan and seconded by Dr. Goodwin, unanimously passed, the petitioner was granted a short variance.
