ARDAGH has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for a consecutive 91-hour period to occur sometime between January 17, 2018, and April 15, 2018, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow the continued operation of the glass melting furnaces, and continued glass production in idle mode, with excess visible emissions while ARDAGH shuts down the scrubber and EP to perform required maintenance on said emissions control equipment.

Mr. Moore presented the Staff Report.

VITRO has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 1080, 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for 16 consecutive days to occur sometime between February 17, 2018 and March 18, 2018, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow the continued operation of the glass melting furnace and continued glass production without the use of the CEMS/COMS, and with excess PM10, Sox, and visible emissions while VITRO shuts down the scrubber and EP to conduct a clean out of the EP and maintenance on the screw conveyors.

Mr. Moore referred to page two of the Staff Report under Petitioner's Request. Petitioner requests that the short variance should be for 16 days versus 14 consecutive days as mentioned in the Staff Report. Mr. Moore also referred to page two of the Staff Report. Under Excess Emissions, VITRO estimates 384 hours versus 336 hours and 16 days versus 14 days, as mentioned in the Staff Report, to complete said project. As a result, an increase is expected in visible emissions to be as high as 40% opacity during the variance period versus 30% as mentioned in the Staff Report. Page four of the Staff Report under Recommendations, condition #1 states a 14-day period and should be a 16-day period. Page five of the Staff Report under item #6, PM10 emissions shall not exceed 3,463 pounds and condition # 7 Excess Sox emissions, shall not exceed 7,650 pounds.
