GUARDIAN has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 2201, 2410, 2520, 4104, and 4354 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance will be for a consecutive 48 hour period to occur sometime between June 20, 2018, and July 20,

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2018, inclusive. If granted, the variance will allow the continued operation of the glass melting furnace, and continued glass production, with excess visible emissions while GUARDIAN shuts down the scrubber, EP, and SCR, in order to clean and inspect the EP.
