PEM has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, and 2520 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for a consecutive 12 hour period to occur sometime between September 19, 2018, and December 17, 2018, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow for continued ethanol fermentation while the RTO and scrubbers are shut down for preventative maintenance.

<u>Hearing Board Comments</u>: Mr. Mulligan asked District Staff if the facility will have to pay offsets if excess VOC's are over two thousand pounds. Mr. Kalashian answered yes. Ms. Bottorff added that it is based on the source test, which is under normal operations, and currently, they are in full production and added it would not be that high because they will not be producing ethanol. Mr. Houlihan explained that the reason why the VOC emissions are estimated high is because usually the RTO is down and the scrubber does most of the controlling; in this case, the scrubber will also be down for 4-hours.
