BAKER has requested an extension of the previously granted regular variance from the requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4305, 4306, and 4320, in addition to conditions of the subject permits. The requested variance period would be from November 1, 2019, to January 10, 2020. If granted, the variance would allow for excess CO emissions from the boiler until a compliance source test is initiated, the boiler is put into DEU status, or the boiler is shut down permanently in anticipation of installing and operating the new boiler.

Hearing Board Comments: Mr. Boren asked if the applicant had a plan to avoid further breakdowns since there have been many delays. Mr. Rocha responded that the extension of the variance was caused because of the purchase of a new boiler to replace the Erie boiler. The delays are because of installation. The facility is currently looking to repair or replace the eerie boiler. Mr. Boren asked that the petitioner submit a plan for redundancy to the District. Assistant Counsel Fierro advised the board that they could not impose additional conditions, such as requiring additional redundancy.

ARDAGH has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and 4354 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for a consecutive 144 hour period to occur sometime between December 24, 2019, and January 2, 2020, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow the continued operation of the glass melting furnaces, and continued glass production in idle mode, with excess visible emissions while ARDAGH shuts down the scrubber and EP to perform required maintenance on said emissions control equipment.

<u>Hearing Board Comments</u>: Dr. Goodwin asked how many minutes of visible emissions was expected. Ms. Arunagiri answered that usually the visible emissions are for less than 15 minute increments at a time.
