Pacific Ethanol Stockton has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4623 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance would be for a consecutive 12-hour period to occur sometime between May 3, 2017, and July 31, 2017, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow for continued ethanol fermentation while the RTO and scrubbers are shut down for the proposed testing.

The petitioner had no further comments.

Mr. Kanai verified that there are no changes to the variance except for the date and time from the past variance in February.

Ms. Bussard answered that it is the District's understanding that conditions are the same as the last variance back in February.

Mr. Smedshammer asked if the window of time for the variance was long enough considering that it seems to be a big project.

Mr. King replied that the window of the variance will be long enough, due to reasons of just finalizing electric startup of the unit.
