Mr. Houlihan presented the Staff Report.

Manteca Waste Water Treatment has requested a short variance from applicable requirements of District Rules 2010 and 4308 in addition to the applicable conditions on the subject permit. The requested variance period would be from May 1, 2019, to July 29, 2019, inclusive. If granted, it would allow for the installation of the subject boiler so that it can go through emissions testing to demonstrate compliance with the emissions standards of Rule

Petitioners Comments: Mr. Swain mentioned that the project is an overall vision of the City's Waste Fuel Program. Manteca Waste Water is trying to meet multiple agency requirements.

Mr. Stovall asked if the flow rates would be adjusted to meet the compliance standard.

Mr. Erdmann responded that the Btu value of the waste gas is variable which is one of the challenges into designing the combustion and control system. The methane concentration is expected to between 25% and 35%, which is too low to sustain combustion on its own; therefore, it will be mixed with natural gas to boost it up and get a stable flame. A low NOx burner with flue gas recirculation will be used to take some for the exhaust gas product back to the combustion air intake to lower the flame temperature to reduce NOx. Based on past experience with similar fuels and applications, there is a high degree of confidence that the 30 ppm NOx and 400ppm carbon monoxide will be met.
