 - A. Docket S-07-31E Crimson Resource Management.

On June 21, 2007, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance from June 21, 2007, to June 30, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070.7.0, 2201, 2520, and 4623, and allowed the continued operation of the subject equipment without an operational VRS while maintenance activities are performed at the 1-C Gas Plant.

B. Docket S-07-38E – Chevron USA Inc.

On June 21, 2007, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance from June 21, 2007, to July 20, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 1070, 2010, 2070.7.0, 2201, 2520, 4311, 4623, and 4801 and allowed the continued operation of the subject equipment without an operational VRS and allowed the non-emergency use of the emergency flare while the reverse osmosis unit at 26C cogeneration facility was replaced.

C. <u>Docket S-07-41E</u> – Chevron USA Inc.

On June 21, 2007, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance from June 21, 2007, to June 30, 2007. Said variance provided relief for Chevron USA Inc. from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 4623 and allowed the continued operation of the subject tanks without an operational VRS while the Crimson Resource Management Company gas plant was shutdown and until Crimson Resource Management Company was able to receive gas from the Chevron USA Inc. VRS.

C. <u>Docket S-07-43E</u> – La Paloma Generating Company

On June 29, 2007, Hearing Board Chairman Mr. Hollis Carlile approved an emergency variance from June 22, 2007, to July 21, 2007. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2520 and allowed the continued operation of the subject turbine without a fuel flow meter as required.
