5. The Southern Region Hearing Board approved the following emergency variances orders:

A. Docket S-08-52E – Chevron USA Inc.

On August 8, 2008, Hearing Board member Kimm Wolber RN, COHN-S approved an emergency variance from August 7, 2008 to September 5, 2008. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4623 and allowed the subject tanks to continue to store VOC containing liquids without an operational Vapor Recovery System.

B. Docket S-08-53E - Rio Bravo Tomato

On August 13, 2008, Hearing Board Chair Hollis Carlile approved an emergency variance from August 8, 2008 to September 7, 2008. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070.7.0, 2201, 4305, and 4306 and allowed the continued operation of the subject boiler with excess emissions.

C. Docket S-08-56E - Aera Energy, LLC.

On August 19, 2008, Hearing Board member Kimm Wolber RN, COHN-S approved an emergency variance from August 19, 2008 to August 28 2008. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, and 2520, and 4623 and allowed the subject tanks to continue to store VOC containing liquids without an operational Vapor Recovery System.

D. Docket S-08-58E - Crimson Resource Management

On August 27, 2008, Hearing Board member Kimm Wolber RN, COHN-S approved an emergency variance from September 3, 2008 to September 5, 2008. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, and 4623 and allowed the subject tanks to continue to store VOC containing liquids without an operational Vapor Recovery System.
