A. Docket S-11-11E – Berry Petroleum Company

On March 15, 2011, Hearing Board Chair, Hollis Carlile, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from March 15, 2011, to April 13, 2011. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2520, 4305, 4306, and 4320 and allowed for the postponement of the source tests until the subject equipment are repaired.

B. Docket S-11-16E – Naftex Operating Company

On March 31, 2011, Hearing Board member, John Stovall, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from March 30, 2011, to April 13, 2011. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 4409, and 4623 and allowed for the continued storage of VOC containing liquids in storage tanks without an operational vapor recovery system.

C. Docket S-11-17E – Delta Trading

On March 31, 2011, Hearing Board member, John Stovall, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from March 30, 2011, until April 2, 2011. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 4305, and 4306 and allowed for the subject boiler to extend its start up time beyond two hours to cure a newly installed refractory.
