11. The Southern Region Hearing Board Southern Region Hearing Board has heard and granted the following emergency variance since the March hearing:
  - A. S-18-15E Aera Energy LLC

On March 21, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from March 21, 2018 through April 19, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2080, 2201, 2520, 4201, 4301, 4305, 4306, 4320, 4405, 4406, 4409, and 4801 and allowed for field gas with excess H<sub>2</sub>S to enter the fuel gas distribution system and steam generators utilizing the gas as fuel to exceed their permitted SO<sub>x</sub> emission limit.
