 - A. <u>S-18-05E</u> California Resources Production Company

On January 23, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from January 23, 2018, through February 22, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2520, and 4409 and allowed for an extension of repair period on a leaking component.

B. <u>S-18-06E</u> - California Resources Production Company

On January 26, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from January 29, 2018, through February 28, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2520, and 4409 and allowed for an extension of repair period on a leaking component.

C. <u>S-18-07E</u> - Aera Energy LLC

On February 5, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance for February 26, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4623, and allowed for continued production and storage of VOC containing liquids into the subject tanks without a functional and operating VRS while a third party vendor shuts down the supply of natural gas.
