A. S-18-17E Alon Bakersfield Refining

On April 6, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from April 6, 2018 through May 5, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4101, and allowed ALON to operate the flare with excess visible emissions while Boiler 81H1 is repaired.

B. S-18-20E California Resources Production Corporation

On April 19, 2018, Hearing Board Chair, William Bland, acting for and on behalf of the Southern Region Hearing Board, approved an emergency variance from April 19, 2018 through May 18, 2018. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070, 2520, and 4409, and allowed for an extension of repair period while CRPC schedules a workover rig to come to the facility and complete repairs.
