5. Emergency Variances:

The Southern Region Hearing Board approved the following emergency variance orders:

A. <u>Docket #S-05-32E</u> – AES Delano Energy

On April 8, 2005, Hearing Board Chairman Mr. Hollis B. Carlile approved an emergency variance effective from April 11, 2005, to April 30, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 1080, 2070.7.0, and 2201 to allow the continued operation of boiler unit #1 without an operational and certified COMS while a new monitoring system is installed and testing to comply with 40 CFR, Part 60, Appendix B, Performance Specification 1, is completed.

B. <u>Docket #S-05-33E</u> – Pastoria Energy Facility, LLC

On April 15, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective from April 15, 2005, to May 11, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010 and 2201 to allow turbine commissioning activities to be conducted with excess CO emissions.

C. <u>Docket #S-05-33E</u> – Pastoria Energy Facility, LLC

On April 21, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective on April 21, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0 and 2201 to allow the exceedance of the permitted one-hour limitation for turbine unit startups.
