## 5. Emergency Variances:

The Southern Region Hearing Board approved the following emergency variance orders:

A. <u>Docket #S-05-35E</u> – Aera Energy LLC

Interim

On May 6, 2005, Hearing Board Chairman Mr. Hollis B. Carlile approved an emergency variance effective from May 10, 2005, to May 11, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2010, 2201, and 4623 to allow the continued storage of VOC containing fluids in the subject tanks and gas floatation units without VRS while power to the facility is curtailed and maintenance activities are conducted.

B. <u>Docket #S-05-36E</u> – Big West of California, LLC

On May 6, 2005, Hearing Board member Mr. Hollis B. Carlile approved an emergency variance effective from May 10, 2005, to May 17, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2080, 2201, 2520, and 4623 to allow the continued storage of VOC containing fluids in the subject storage tanks without an operational VRS while VRS #8 is shutdown and the float valve in the compressor's discharge knock out is replaced.

C. <u>Docket #S-05-38E</u> – Chevron USA Inc.

On May 17, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective from May 17, 2005, to June 1, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4623 to allow CUSA to maintain regulated fluids in the three subject tanks during the time necessary to repair the vapor piping.

D. <u>Docket #S-05-40E</u> – California Dairies Inc.

On May 17, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective from May 26, 2005, to June 24, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4701 to allow non-emergency operation of three engines units during the electrical tie-in of a cogeneration turbine unit.

E. <u>Docket #S-05-43E</u> – Inergy Propane Inc.

On May 17, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective from May 18, 2005, to June 16, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4703 to allow the commissioning of the subject turbine unit with excess emissions.

F. <u>Docket #S-05-44E</u> – Chevron USA Inc.

On May 20, 2005, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, CHON-S, approved an emergency variance effective from May 25, 2005, to June 8, 2005. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4623 to allow CUSA to maintain petroleum liquids in the four storage tanks without an operational VRS until the switch to alternative power source and repairs of the electrical control panel can be completed.
