5. The Southern Region Hearing Board approved the following emergency variance orders:

A. <u>Docket #S-06-20E</u> – Midway Sunset Cogeneration Company

On March 30, 2006, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective from March 30, 2006, to April 26, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4703 to allow the CEMS to be taken offline for repair and maintenance while the subject cogeneration units continue to operate.

B. <u>Docket #S-06-22E</u> – Aera Energy LLC

On March 30, 2006, Hearing Board member Mr. Charles Brehmer, approved an emergency variance effective from March 30, 2006, to April 7, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4623 to allow the continued storage of VOC containing fluids in the subject tanks without an operational VRS during the period necessary to install the new stainless steel section of pipe and fuel meter.

C. Docket #S-06-23E - Chevron USA Inc.

On April 5, 2006, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective from April 19, 2006, to May 18, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4623 to allow the subject tanks to continue storing VOC containing fluids without and operational VRS during the scheduled PG&E electrical outage.

D. Docket #S-06-24E - Chevron USA Inc.

On April 11, 2006, Hearing Board member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective from April 7, 2006 to May 6, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201 and 4623 to allow the subject tanks to continue storing VOC containing fluids without an operational VRS during the repair of the compressor and vapor piping.

E. <u>Docket #S-06-31E</u> – Big West of California LLC

On May 1, 2006, Hearing Board member Mr. Hollis Carlile approved an emergency variance effective from May 1, 2006 to May 30, 2006. Said variance provided relief from specific requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2001 and 4305 to allow BWC to delay testing of the subject heaters until such time as repairs to the systems are completed and the required tests can be scheduled.
