The Southern Region Hearing Board has approved the following emergency variance orders:

- A. Docket #S-02-11E – Aera Energy LLC

On April 11, 2002, Hearing Board Member Mr. Marvin Dean, approved an emergency variance effective between April 10, 2002, and April 12, 2002. Said variance provides relief from the requirements of District Rule 2070.7.0, as it pertains to the release of excess sulfur emissions associated with the repair of a pressurized field gas line.

- B. Docket #S-02-12E – Shell/Equilon Refinery

On May 9, 2002, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective for a 16-hour period between May 9, 2002, and May 10, 2002. Said variance provides relief from the requirements of District Rule 2070.7.0 as it pertains to the release of excess VOC emissions associated with the continued operation of the petroleum storage while vapor compressor #73C-1 is replaced due to the units overheating.

On May 23, 2002, Hearing Board Chair Mr. Hollis B. Carlile, denied an emergency variance, because the subject event failed to qualify for emergency variance relief.

- D. Docket #S-02-14E – ChevronTexaco USA, Inc. (Kern River Oilfield)

On June 12, 2002, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective for an 18-hour period between June 29, 2002, and July 15, 2002. Said variance provides relief from the requirements of District Rules 1080, 2010, 2070.7.0, 2201, 4623, and 4701 as they pertain to the release of excess VOC emissions while crude oil production and cogeneration facilities operate contrary to ATC and PTO conditions during a scheduled power outage.

- E. Docket #S-02-15E – ChevronTexaco USA, Inc. (Angus Lease)

On June 12, 2002, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective for an 18-hour period between June 15, 2002, and July 15, 2002. Said variance provides relief from the requirements of District Rules 2070.7.0, 2201, and 4623 as they pertain to the release of excess VOC emissions while the crude oil production facilities operate contrary to PTO conditions during a scheduled power outage.

- F. Docket #S-02-16E – Sycamore Cogeneration Company

On May 30, 2002, Hearing Board Member Ms. Kimm Wolber, RN, COHN-S, approved an emergency variance effective between May 23, 2002, and June 22, 2002. Said variance provides relief from the requirements of District Rules 1080 and 2070.7.0 as they pertain to continued facility operations without a functional NOx analyzer until a replacement can be installed and operating properly.
