Dave Baldwin presented the report. Chevron is seeking a short variance to occur between September 11, 2008, and December 9, 2008, to allow tank T-1 in continual operation without a vapor recovery system.

Mr. Gruber stated the District's Staff report was accurate in describing Chevron's petition. He indicated a need to correct the tank identification numbers. He pointed out that the vapor recovery system will only be offline for a short time to move the piping and add the valve to tie in the replacement tank without the need to pursue a second variance. Mr. Gruber added under the worst case scenario the maximum excess emissions will be less than eight pounds.

Ms. Dunn asked why the tank was being replaced. Mr. Langner responded the tank had been damaged several months ago.

E. S-08-51S Short San Joaquin Refining Company Corner of Stanislaus and Shell

Petitioner: David Campbell; Scott Faulkenberg

Dave Baldwin presented the report. San Joaquin Refining Company is requesting a short variance to occur between September 3, 2008, and December 3, 2008, to allow an increased concentration of H₂S gas in the inlet to the thermal oxidizer until the problem can be diagnosed and the concentrations be reduced below 10 ppm.

Mr. Campbell stated the District's Staff report was accurate in describing San Joaquin Refining Company's case and stated that normal tail gas range over the years has been 2 to 3 ppm H₂S and they have been aggressively pursuing the reason as to why this range has climbed to the 10 limit.

Mr. Carlile questioned how or why the variance would help fix the problems that have been going on for years. Mr. Garcia mentioned a change out of amine unit brought the range down. Mr. Campbell presented a report of emissions before and after the change of amine.

Ms. Dunn asked if nine days were enough to solve the problem. Mr. Campbell answered yes. Ms. Dunn asked if any other consultants are working with them. Mr. Campbell answered yes.
