Patrick Houlihan presented the report. Crimson Resource Management is seeking a short variance period for a consecutive four day period to occur between October 20, 2009, and October 23, 2009, to allow the continued storage of VOC containing liquids in storage tanks without an operational vapor recovery system while Crimson conducts the necessary maintenance activities.

Petitioner, Debra Sovay, stated these are standard maintenance activities and nothing outside of the ordinary is planned. Mr. Carlile asked if this was a complete gas plant, with butane, etc. Petitioner, Justin Helgeson indicated they have about 13 to 14 million cubic feet come in everyday and added that they drop out about 25,000 gallons of liquids, then separate the propane, butane, and everything else is gasoline product. The liquid is stored on-site in pressure tanks and the natural gas is sent out.

Patrick Houlihan presented the report. Kern River Cogeneration Company (KRCC) is seeking a short variance for a cumulative 24-hour period to occur between October 14, 2009, and January 10, 2010, to allow the operation of the subject turbine unit with excess Nox and CO emissions while KRCC conducts the necessary performance tests.

Petitioner, Cory Eagar, indicated this is part of their ongoing retrofit of their combustion hardware. Unit 2 will receive the latest revision of the nozzles. They are requesting a 24 hour variance period, but should only take eight hours. Extra time is requested in case more time is needed. The emissions listed in their report are the worst case scenario.

Patrick Houlihan presented the report. Chevron USA, Inc. (CUSA) is requesting a short variance period for a cumulative, consecutive 12-hour period to occur between October 14, 2009, and November 20, 2009, to allow the subject tanks to operate without a vapor recovery system while CUSA installs a new valve on the vapor recovery system line.

Petitioner, Larry Landis, stated the District's presentation was complete but wanted to stress that the purpose of adding the valve is to be able to plumb all of the tank vapors from this facility with a larger tank facility at a distant location to install a sulfur scrubbing unit to comply with Rule 4320. Mr. Bland asked if they are installing a pipe or a switch. Mr. Landis indicated they are installing a valve, but eventually some piping will be installed to reach the valve.

Chevron USA, Inc. (CUSA) is requesting a short variance for 504 cumulative non-consecutive hours to occur between October 14, 2009, and January 11, 2010, to allow the subject storage tanks to continue to store VOC containing liquids without an operational vapor recovery system.

Patrick Houlihan stated pursuant to a telephone call from the Petitioner, a change to Condition Seven (7), Page Four (4) was requested and is to read as follows:

7. CUSA shall notify the District at least 24 hours prior to each scheduled shutdown of the VRS.

Mr. Stovall asked if the District is recommending this change. Patrick Houlihan stated yes.

Petitioner, Martin Lundy, stated they do not expect to use the entire 504 hours. David Moore stated they are taking advantage of Crimson's mandatory shutdown.
