If granted, the variance would allow Pastoria additional time, up to August 7, 2017 to complete the annual source testing.

Ms. Bussard presented the Staff Report.

Chevron has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 4409, 4623, in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested variance would be for a non-consecutive 720 hour-hour period occur sometime between May 10, 2017, and August 8, 2017, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow Chevron to bypass the gas plant while not following all the provisions of District Rule 4409 during the turnaround. It would also allow the continued storage of VOC containing liquids in the two drain tanks without an operating and functional VRS.

Mr. Stovall asked what the estimated dollar lost would be during this shut down period.

Mr. Enns explained that it will be in the millions, considering that they have to account for the gas and oil production loss.

Mr. Padilla asked for clarification on the definition of a short variance.

Ms. Bussard explained that a short variance would be for a span of 90 days total. In this case the facility has a maximum of 30 days non-consecutive if it were to take them that long to complete all maintenance.

The requested short variance would be for a non-consecutive 24- hour period to occur sometime between May 10, 2017, and July 31, 2017 inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow King River Cogeneration Company to operate the combustion turbines with excess NOx and CO emissions while the required reliability testing is conducted.
