<u>Petitioner</u> – Scott Sill and Joe Selgrath represented Lone Star Gas Liquids Processing, Inc.

<u>Public Comment</u> – No Public Comment.

The modified conditions shall be set forth in the Order.

Docket No. S-01-16S, Short Variance, <u>Sunrise Power Company</u>, P O Box 81617, Bakersfield, CA. 93380-1617. Type of Business: Electric Power Generation Plant.

The variance is subject to nine conditions set forth on pages 3 and 4 of the Staff Report. The nine conditions shall be set forth in the Order.

The Chair requested that the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District establish criteria other than Authority to Constructs (ATCs) emissions for start up of new equipment in all testing phases and tune up modes.

Mr. Carrera stated that based on the conversations we had today. The District will be more than willing to meet with each of the Petitioners to set those limits. So that the Hearing Board will have some comfort level that the Emission Reduction Credits (ERCs) will not be an issue. Mr. Carrera noted that the Chair's point was well taken. We will get that information up front next time regardless of whether the manufacturer of that equipment is recalcitrant in supplying that information. We'll make sure that we have some numbers together before we appear before you again.
