<u>Decision</u> – Board Member Bland made the motion to grant the variance subject to twelve conditions with amendments. The original conditions were set forth on pages 4 and 5 of the Staff Report. Board Member Bland stated that the required six findings set forth on pages 2 and 3 of the Staff Report could be made. Seconded by Board Member Wolber and carried unanimously with the following *Roll Call Vote:*

Therefore, the Board granted a Regular Variance to Docket S-02-35R, Cheese & Protein International, Inc. The following conditions were amended. (strike through/deleted and underlined/added):

Condition # 1

The variance shall be effective from November 14, 2002 to June 5, 2003 February 1, 2003, or until compliance is achieved, whichever occurs first.

Condition # 5

The maximum daily production of DPW shall not exceed 110 150 tons per day.

Condition # 10

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By July 5, 2002 March 1, 2003 or no later than 30-days after achieving compliance, whichever occurs first, the Petitioner shall submit to the District a written report. with items A., B., C., D., E., and F. The twelve conditions will be set forth in the Order.

By March 1, 2003 April 1, 2003 or no later than 30-days after achieving compliance, whichever occurs first, the Petitioner shall submit to the District a written report. The report shall include: A., B., C., D., E., and Delete F. The eleven conditions will be set forth in the Order.
