Staff explained that they have a internal policy on how they deal with EVs on a day to day bases on whether or not the District will accept a EV as an emergency and whether it is related to a breakdown or for good cause. Staff noted that each request for a EV that comes before the Board and the District is different and therefore reviewed on a case by case bases by a committee of staff members before it goes before a hearing board member.
