Mr. Cunha, Nisei Farmers League, stated there is a lack of coordinating efforts between the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the Policy Committee. He urged the Study Agency Committee to send a letter to Senator Feinstein and Senator Boxer to address these efforts. Mr. Shipp supported Mr. Cunha's concerns.

Mr. Sadredin stated a letter can be sent to the appropriate entities addressing the need for better research and coordination between the State and Federal government in working with our district. He will also talk with Dr. Telles, to convey this to the ARB Board on our behalf.
